It is the intention of this privacy statement to explain to you the information practices of O'Neill Foley in relation to the information we collect about you and other users.

Please read this Statement carefully as this sets out the basis on which any personal data, we collect from you, or that you provide to us, will be processed by us.

Who are we?

Purpose for processing your data

Why do O'Neill Foley need to collect and store personal data?

For us to provide you with our services we need to collect personal data for quotations and underwriting and for verification purposes as set out by the Central Bank of Ireland requirements. In any event, we are committed to ensuring that the information we collect and use is appropriate for this purpose, and does not constitute an invasion of your privacy.

In terms of being contacted for marketing purposes O'Neill Foley would contact you for additional consent.

How will O'Neill Foley use the personal data it collects about me?

O'Neill Foley will process (collect, store and use) the information you provide in a manner compatible with

the EU's General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR). We will endeavor to keep your information accurate and up to date, and not keep it for longer than is necessary.

O'Neill Foley are required to retain information in accordance with the law, such as information needed for income tax and audit purposes. How long certain kinds of personal data should be kept may also be governed by specific business-sector requirements and agreed practices. Personal data may be held in addition to these periods depending on individual business needs.

Under what circumstances will O'Neill Foley contact me?

Our aim is not to be intrusive, and we undertake not to ask irrelevant or unnecessary questions. Moreover, the information you provide will be subject to rigorous measures and procedures to minimize the risk of unauthorized access or disclosure.

Why we are processing your data? Our legal basis.

Our reason and purpose for processing your personal data is:

- We have your consent.
- We need to process your data to complete the performance of a contract.
- Where you, the data subject is a party to the O'Neill Foley processes data without consent in order to fulfil contractual obligations [such medical details for underwriting, bank account details for contract payment, Tax details, in order to supply products and services, etc.].
- **Legal obligations** that need to be adhered to.
- Protect the **vital interests of the data subject**, including the protection of rights and freedoms.
- Processing that is in the **public interest**.
- Necessary for the **legitimate interests of the data controller** or third party, unless the processing is overridden by the vital interests, including rights and freedoms.
- **National law**.

Special Categories of Personal Data

If we collect any special categories of personal data (e.g. health, religious beliefs, racial, ethnic origin – financial information is not classified as special categories of personal data) – we will ensure the below: -

- We will obtain your explicit consent.
- Ensure the personal data is necessary for employment rights or obligations.
- Protect the vital interests of the data subject, including the protection of rights and freedoms.
- The legitimate activities with appropriate safeguards.
- Preventive or occupational medicine, for the assessment of the working capacity of the employee, medical diagnosis, provision of health or social care treatment, or management of health and social

care systems and services, under the basis that appropriate contracts with health professionals and safeguards are in place.

- **Public health**, ensuring appropriate safeguards is in place for the protection of rights and freedoms of the data subject, or professional secrecy.
- National Laws are upheld in terms of processing genetic, biometric or health data.

Who are we sharing your data with?

We may pass your personal data on to third-party service providers contracted to O'Neill Foley, in the course of dealing with you. Any third parties that we may share your data with are obliged to keep your details securely, and to use them only to fulfil the service they provide on your behalf. When they no longer need your data to fulfil this service, they will dispose of the details in line with O'Neill Foley's procedure. If we wish to pass your sensitive personal data onto a third party we will only do so once we have obtained your consent, unless we are otherwise legally required to.

If we transfer personal data to a third party or outside the EU we as the data controller will ensure the recipient (processor or another controller) has provided the appropriate safeguards and on condition that enforceable data subject rights and effective legal remedies for you the data subject are available.

Data Subjects Rights:

O'Neill Foley facilitate the data subject's rights in line with the data protection policy and the subject access request procedure. This is available on request from Lynn Casey, O'Neill Foley, Patrick's Court, Patrick Street, Kilkenny or lcasey@onf.ie.

Your rights as a data subject:

At any point while we are in possession of or processing your personal data, you, the data subject, have the following rights:

- **Right of access** – you have the right to request a copy of the information that we hold about you.
- **Right of rectification** – you have a right to correct data that we hold about you that is inaccurate or incomplete.
- **Right to be forgotten** – in certain circumstances you can ask for the data we hold about you to be erased from our records
- **Right to restriction of processing** – where certain conditions apply to have a right to restrict the processing.
- **Right of portability** – you have the right to have the data we hold about you transferred to another organization.
- **Right to object** – you have the right to object to certain types of processing such as direct marketing.

- **Right to object to automated processing, including profiling** – you also have the right to be subject to the legal effects of automated processing or profiling.
- **Right to judicial review:** if O’Neill Foley refuse your request under rights of access, we will provide you with a reason as to why. You have the right to complain as outlined in the complaints section below.

All the above requests will be forwarded on should there be a third party involved as we have indicated in the processing of your personal data.

Additional information we are providing you with to ensure we are transparent and fair with our processing.

Retention of your personal data

Data will not be held for longer than is necessary for the purpose(s) for which they were obtained. O’Neill Foley will process personal data in accordance with our retention schedule. This retention schedule has been governed by our regulatory body (Central Bank, Revenue) and our internal governance.

Withdraw consent

If we are relying on your consent to process your data, you can withdraw this at any time – this does not affect the lawfulness of processing based on your consent before its withdrawal.

Complaints

In the event that you wish to make a complaint about how your personal data is being processed by O’Neill Foley (or third parties as described in Who Are We Sharing your Date With section above), or how your complaint has been handled, you have the right to lodge a complaint directly with the supervisory authority and O’Neill Foley, Complaints data protection representatives Data Protection Officer/GDPR Owner Lynn Casey, O’Neill Foley, Patrick’s Court, Patrick’s Street, Kilkenny at 0567721157 or email lcasey@onf.ie.

Failure to provide further information if need see Art 12(e)

If we are collecting your data for a statutory requirement (payroll) or to fulfil a contract (life policy or motor insurance policy) and you cannot provide this data, the consequences of this could mean the contract cannot be completed or details are incorrect.

Profiling – Automatic Decision Making

Should O’Neill Foley need to carry out automatic decision making we will inform the data subject and explain the significance and the envisaged consequences involved. O’Neill Foley will inform the data subject that they can object to this.

E.g. insurance underwriting.

Additional Processing

If we intend to further process your personal data for a purpose other than for which the data was collected, we will provide this information to you prior to processing this data.

If we have received your personal data from another source:

If O’Neill Foley have collected your personal data from another source, O’Neill Foley is committed to

protection and respecting your privacy.

We want to share any other information required to demonstrate that the processing is fair and transparent.

The Categories of personal data we have collected are:

- Who we are sharing this data with?
- If we have received your personal data from another source, we will endeavor to share with you.
- Within one month of obtaining the personal data, in accordance with the specific circumstances of the processing;
- At the first instance of communicating in circumstances where the personal data is used to communicate with the data subject;
- When personal data is first disclosed in circumstances where the personal data is disclosed to another recipient.

The above will not apply when:

- If you already have the information;
- If the provision of the above information proves impossible or would involve an excessive effort
- If obtaining or disclosure of personal data is expressly identified by Member State law; or
- If personal data must remain confidential subject to an obligation of professional secrecy regulated by Member State law, including a statutory obligation of secrecy.

Responsibilities

The Data Protection Officer/GDPR Owner is responsible for ensuring that the privacy notice(s) is correct and that mechanisms exist such as having the Privacy Notice(s) on O'Neill Foley website to make all data subjects aware of the contents of this notice prior to O'Neill Foley commencing collection of their data.

All staff that are required to collect personal data are required to follow this procedure.

Under the EU's General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) personal data is defined as:

“any information relating to an identified or identifiable natural person ('data subject'); an identifiable natural person is one who can be identified, directly or indirectly, in particular by reference to an identifier such as a name, an identification number, location data, an online identifier or to one or more factors specific to the physical, physiological, genetic, mental, economic, cultural or social identity of that natural person”.
